



LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

Central United Methodist Church acknowledges that the building in which we carry out our collective life together occupies and is built upon land that is part of what was first known as Waawiyaataanong ("At the curved shores."), the ancestral and contemporary homeland of the Three Fires Confederacy, but which is now referred to as Detroit. In 1807 the Ojibwe, Odawa, Potawatomi, and Wyandot nations granted use of these sovereign lands to the US government through the Treaty of Detroit. Central United Methodist Church affirms the continued Indigenous sovereignty over these lands and honors all tribes with a connection to Detroit. We commit ourselves to working together with our native brothers and sisters to advance equity in all dimensions of life and to promote a better future for the earth and all its peoples.

GOSPEL LESSONMatthew 5-7 (Selected Verses)*

D. B. Hart Translation

You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt should become insipid, by what shall it be made salty? You are the light of the world. So let your light shine out before humanity, so that they may see your good works and may glorify God in the heavens.

You have heard that it was said, ‘an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’ Whereas I tell you not to oppose the wicked one by force; Rather, whosoever strikes you upon the right cheek, turn to them the other as well. You have heard that it has been said, ‘You shall love your neighbor and shall hate your enemy,’ whereas I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.

When you pray do not be like those who are play-acting; For they love to pray while standing in the synagogues and on the corners of streets, so that they may be visible to all; I tell you truly, they have their recompense.

See the birds of the sky – that they neither sow nor reap nor gather into granaries; and your heavenly God feeds them; are you not more excellent than they? But who among you can, by worrying, lengthen the span of their life by a single cubit? And why do you worry over clothing? Look closely at the lilies of the field – how they grow; They neither labor nor spin; yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his glory was garbed like one of them.

Everyone, therefore, who hears these sayings of mine and enacts them shall be likened to a prudent one who built their house upon rock. And the rain descended and the rivers flooded in and the winds blew and fell upon that house, and it did not fall; For it had been founded upon rock.

THE TEACHING WINDOW

The 3-lancet traceried window on the right above the gallery shows Christ seated in the center lancet preaching His great Sermon on the Mount. He is surrounded by a multitude of persons, some His disciples, others just ordinary men, women, and children who had flocked to hear Him, who are portrayed in the left and right lancets.

The predella subjects below illustrate some of the great truths He uttered at other times when he taught His disciples. At the right is Christ preaching in the fields, “Consider the lilies of the field how they grow...” (Matthew 6:28). In the center He is preaching from the boat, the multitude which followed Him shown seated on the shore listening raptly. In the left medallion Christ is shown teaching in the Synagogue on the Sabbath.

The rose tracery above the window shows the boy Christ preaching in the Temple with the learned doctors listening astounded and amazed at His wisdom, while he says, “Why did you seek me? Did you not know that it is necessary for me to be in the home of my Abba?” (Luke 2:49).
