I plead with you, then, in the name of our Redeemer, to lead a life worthy of your call. Treat one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the peace that binds you together. There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called into one hope when you were called. There is one Savior, one faith, one baptism, one God and Creator of all, who is over all, who works through all and is within all.

Each of us has received God's grace in the measure in which Christ has bestowed it. Thus you find scripture saying, "You ascended on high, leading captives in your train, and giving gifts to people." "You ascended" – what does this mean but that Christ first descended into the lower regions of the earth? The One who descended is the very One who ascended high above the heavens in order to fill the whole universe.
