FIELD TRIP FROM CENTRAL'S GREEN TEAM,

Join us for this field trip to enjoy and learn about God's creation:

Sandhill Crane Migration Spectacular at Haehnle Sanctuary. Sunday Nov. 12, 2023 We'll carpool from church leaving at about 1:30 p.m. (after coffee hour) to head to this sanctuary near Jackson, MI. We'll stop at the Dexter Cider Mill on the way. If you are able, we will take a walk through the autumn woods and native prairies. Even if you cannot walk you can stay to watch from the hill where there are benches, (handicappers can drive right to the site) as up to 2000 Sandhill Cranes fly in to roost in the marsh for the night as they have been doing since the last ice age. Dress warmly, as it can be cold. A blanket or lawn chair to sit on would come in handy. Driving time 1.5 hours not including cider mill stop. If you want to skip the walk and join us on the hill at 4 pm, take I-94 to the Race Road exit just be-

fore Jackson. Go north until the road ends, turn left and look for Haehnle Sanctuary on the right about 2 miles down.

Aldo Leopold once wrote: "When we hear (a Sandhill Crane's) call we hear no mere bird. We hear the trumpet in the orchestra of evolution...a symbol of our untamable past."

We'll also stop in Chelsea for dinner on the way home for those amenable. With a dinner stop we'll get home by about 8:30 p.m. For

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

Central United Methodist Church acknowledges that the building in which we carry out our collective life together occupies and is built upon land that is part of what was first known as Waawiyaataanong ("At the curved shores."), the ancestral and contemporary homeland of the Three Fires Confederacy, but which is now referred to as Detroit. In 1807 the Ojibwe, Odawa, Potawatomi, and Wyandot nations granted use of these sovereign lands to the US government through the Treaty of Detroit. Central United Methodist Church affirms the continued Indigenous sovereignty over these lands and honors all tribes with a connection to Detroit. We commit ourselves to working together with our native brothers and sisters to advance equity in all dimensions of life and to promote a better future for the earth and all its peoples.
