

**Group Name: Woorisori\* (pronounced 00-ree-so-ree)** Music Genre: Samulnori (sah-mool-no-ree) Performer Ages: 11—18 (middle School and high school students)

Woorisori\* (pronounced 00-ree-so-ree) performs samulnori, a genre of percussion music where musicians perform Korean rhythms with traditional instruments in a seated position. Translating to "the playing of four things", samulnori uses four types of instruments in the forms of wooden drums with animal hides and metal gongs to produce sound. Originating from farmers' fold traditions and them the later professional traveling musicians and entertainers, samulnori offers a glimpse of the past through these dynamic sounds and timeless rhythms.
