After Jesus said this, he looked up to heaven and said, "Abba, the hour has come! Glorify your Only Begotten that I may glorify you, Through the authority you've given me over all humankind, by bestowing eternal life on all those you gave me. And this is eternal life: to know you, the only true God, and the one you have sent, Jesus, the Messiah.

I have given you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. Now, Abba, glorify me with your own glory, the glory I had with you before the world began. I have manifested your Name to those you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me; and now they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you've entrusted to me does indeed come from you. I entrusted to them the message you entrusted to me, and they received it. They know that I really came from you; they believe it was you who sent me.

And it's for them that I pray—not for the world, but for these you've given me—for they are really yours just as all that belongs to me is yours, and all that belongs to you is mine. It is in them that I have been glorified.

I am in the world no more, but while I am coming to you, they are still in the world. Abba, holy God, protect those who you have given me with your Name—the Name that you gave me—that they may be one, even as we are one.

As long as I was with them, I guarded them with your Name which you gave me. I kept careful watch, and not one of them was lost, except for the one who was destined to be lost in fulfillment of scripture. Now I am coming to you; I say all this while I am still in the world that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

I gave them your word, and the world has hated them for it because they don't belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. I don't ask you to take them out of the world, but guard them from the Evil One. They are not of the world, any more then I am of the world.

To them I have revealed your Name, and I will continue to reveal it so that the love you have for me may live in them, just as I may live in them.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

Central United Methodist Church acknowledges that the building in which we carry out our collective life together occupies and is built upon land that is part of what was first known as Waawiyaataanong ("At the curved shores."), the ancestral and contemporary homeland of the Three Fires Confederacy, but which is now referred to as Detroit. In 1807 the Ojibwe, Odawa, Potawatomi, and Wyandot nations granted use of these sovereign lands to the US government through the Treaty of Detroit. Central United Methodist Church affirms the continued Indigenous sovereignty over these lands and honors all tribes with a connection to Detroit. We commit ourselves to working together with our native brothers and sisters to advance equity in all dimensions of life and to promote a better future for the earth and all its peoples. Jill Hardt Zundel was ordained as an elder in Christ's holy Church, June 7, 1995 in the former Detroit conference. Through the grace of God, she was appointed Pastor at Detroit: Zion United Methodist Church, Hazel Park: First United Methodist Church, Associate Pastor at Clarkston United Methodist Church, Pastor of Grace United Methodist Church and Detroit: Central United Methodist Church.
