Earth teach me bravery... to face life with courage, make positive choices and defend what is right for ourselves, our families, and our communities.

Earth teach me honesty...living together with integrity and acceptance of all who share this land.

Earth teach me humility...which teaches us to live selflessly and know we are a sacred part of creation.

Earth teach me love...to know that when we can love ourselves truly we are at peace with ourselves, the balance of life, and also with the creator.

Earth teach me respect...to honor all creation and to treat all creation as we would like to be treated.

Earth teach me truth...asking for help in showing honor and sincerity to all who walk with us on this earth.

Earth teach me wisdom... to cherish knowledge and use our gifts wisely, recognizing our differences in kind and respectful ways.

*SCRIPTURE Matthew 1:1-17 First Nations Version Here is the record of the ancestry of Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, a descendant of Much Loved One (David) and of Father of Many Nations (Abraham). From Father of Many Nations (Abraham) to Much Loved One (David), his ancestors were:

Father of Many Nations (Abraham), He Made Us Laugh (Isaac), Heel Grabber (Jacob), Give Him Praise (Judah), and his brothers, He Breaks Through (Perez) and his brother First Light (Zerah) whose mother was **Fruit of Palm Tree (Tamar)** ... [several more ancestors] ... Moves with Strength (Boaz), whose mother was **Boastful Woman (Rahab)**, He Works Hard (Obed), whose mother was **Beautiful Friend (Ruth)**, Original Man (Jesse), who was father of the great chief Much Loved One (David).

From Much Loved One (David) to the removal of to Village of Confusion (Babylon), the ancestors of Creator Sets Free (Jesus) were: Much Loved One (David), Stands in Peace (Solomon), whose mother, **Daughter of Seven (Bathsheeba)**, was the wife of Fire from Creator (Uriah) ... [several more ancestors] ...

From the removal to Village of Confusion (Babylon) to the birth of Creator Sets Free (Jesus), his ancestors were:

Chosen by Creator (Jeconiah), Ask Creator (Shealtiel), Born in Village of Confusion (Zerubbabel) ... [several more ancestors] ... Heel Grabber (Jacob), and He Gives Sons (Joseph), who was the husband of **Bitter Tears (Mary)**, who gave birth to Creator Sets Free (Jesus), who is the Chosen One.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

Central United Methodist Church acknowledges that the building in which we carry out our collective life together occupies and is built upon land that is part of what was first known as Waawiyaataanong ("At the curved shores."), the ancestral and contemporary homeland of the Three Fires Confederacy, but which is now referred to as Detroit. In 1807 the Ojibwe, Odawa, Potawatomi, and Wyandot nations granted use of these sovereign lands to the US government through the Treaty of Detroit. Central United Methodist Church affirms the continued Indigenous sovereignty over these lands and honors all tribes with a connection to Detroit. We commit ourselves to working together with our native brothers and sisters to advance equity in all dimensions of life and to promote a better future for the earth and all its peoples.
